Centre bans jacuzzi readings

But when they turned up they were told they could not go ahead with it.

Organiser Val Kirkham, of Regent Street, Nelson, said: "We were told that they did not want that kind of publicity for their centre. Apparently it is okay for mixed groups to use the jacuzzl—so long as they don't read poetry."

Only five of the group's 10 members turned up — and one of them admitted to bringing his swimming trunks.



Val said: "We do feel upset, and we will be making every effort to find a Jacuzzi which will welcome poetry."

Another group member Dave Cunliffe of Copster Green, said: "I have come all the way over here to join in, only to find we have been banned. It is a long way to come for nothing. Val told them exactly what we were planning when she booked."

The poets planned to sit among the bubbles reading extracts from their own work. They had already dropped the idea of inviting the public along because of lack of space.





Garden plot fury as MP is snubbed!

A RIGHT blooming row has blossomed down at the allotments — Pendle Tory MP John Lee has been barred from visiting a blind organic gardener's plot in Nelson!

The ban came after the committee had a crisis meeting in a shed ... and decided to tell Mr Lee to "keep off the grass", and any other part of their patch.

The green-fingered growers say the snub has nothing to do with politics.

But it has left organic gardener Mr Wolfram Thome and his wife, Valerie, who issued the invite, furious

And John Lee has branded the ban "silly and ridiculous"

The VIP trip to Nelson's Swinden

Hall allotments should have taken place

today (Friday).

But days before the "blue" was due to bloom, trouble took root.

An anti-Tory slogan was daubed on the committee shed and a pro-Labour

poster sprouted in a greenhouse. The "storm in a plant pot" when the committee poured weedkiller on the plan to welcome the politician.

They have given no reason for the rebuff, but say the decision is definitely non-political.

Fuss

Mrs Thome said: "John Lee helped get us a fence from the council so we invited him to take a look at our plot by way of a thank-you. We can't under-stand the fuss."

Said Mr Lee: "I have helped the allotments groups in the past, and as an MP, I fully expect, within reason, to be able to visit things in my constitu ency, particularly at the invitation of an allotment owner.

"I can assure the allotment holders I am unlikely to stand in the middle of the allotments and hand out pictures of John Major and copies of our campaign leaflet or let off blue balloons."

However, unrepentant committee members dug in their heels when ques tioned about the bar.

Secretary of the Swin-den Hall Allotments committee, chimney sweep Mr George Wilkinson, of Regent Street, said: "Everything regarding John Lee has been resolved. There was a committee meeting last Sunday in our allotment hut and Ken Metcalfe, the secretary of all the Nelson allotments, was present.

"The issue was discussed at length, a vote taken, and it was decided by nine votes to two that John Lee was not allowed to visit out allotments. We are not politically minded, it has nothing to do with politics," said Mr Metcalfe, who refused to comment





MP defies allotments 'ban'



PENDLE MP John Lee visited Swinden Allotments in Nelson on Friday, despite a committee ban.

Local organic gardener Valerie Thome and her disabled husband Wolfram were able to show him their pride and joy plot, because in the event the committee offered no resistance to the visit.

Nelson Allotments Committee chairman Mr Ken Metcalfe refuses to comment publicly about the apparent climbdown over the matter, but did speak with Mr Lee at his constituency surgery on Saturday, and is understood to have applications of the south

Lee at his constituency surgery on Saturday, and is understood to have apologised for the snub.

Said Mr Lee of the visit: "As far as I was concerned, it was all very pleasant and relaxed. There was no attempt to prevent us from entering and, as I was invited by one of the allotment holders, I was delighted to go and look at the tremendous efforts that go into the allotments."

Mr Lee confirmed that he had spoken to Mr Metcalfe about the "no visit" vote of the committee reported in this newspaper last week.

Victimisation

"I suspect there has been a certain clash of personalities," he said. "I am hopeful of ongoing good relations with the allotment holders, and hope there is no victimisation or unpleasantness in future."

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Meanwhile, former Labour voter Val, who issued the invitation to Mr Lee and found herself at odds with the Swinden allotments committee because of it, reckons the incident has changed her political allegiance for

"We were delighted with the way that the day turned out, and everybody had a levely time," she said. "But I have been disgusted at the attitude of Left wingers in the area. I am all for freedom of choice and expression, and if that is the way they behave I will vote Conservative in future."







